This statement relates to actions and activities during the financial year 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019.

As part of the HVAC sector, Daikin UK recognises that it has a responsibility to take a robust approach to slavery and human trafficking.

Daikin UK is absolutely committed to preventing slavery and human trafficking in its corporate activities, and to ensuring that its supply chains are free from slavery and human trafficking.

Daikin uses the OECD Multi National Enterprise (MNE) policy for procurement on a global basis, which covers human rights and responsible sourcing within the supply chain.

Daikin UK purchases its AC equipment from Daikin factories in Belgium, Czech, Italy and Turkey, which adhere to our EU and Global procurement policy that follows the OECD MNE guidelines.

In addition, Daikin holds certification from the BES 6001 Framework Standard for Responsible Sourcing, which covers human rights within the supply chain.
